

What Does "Road Closed" Mean To **YOU**?



For the safety of crews working on roadways, drivers are reminded that a **ROAD CLOSED** sign means just that; **you cannot enter or cross the barrier.**

If you try to cross the barrier, you may damage road work, you may get stuck, or you may damage your vehicle. More importantly, you will endanger the safety of our workers and yourself, and because of that, you may also be subject to a citation.

If you live on the road that is closed please safely park your vehicle and walk to your residence until the street is open for thru traffic. If you are not able to walk the distance to your residence please carefully approach a crew member to discuss access to the street and residence while work is underway.

Street Sweeping Readiness

During street sweeping, parking will be restricted on the scheduled sweeping day. The Borough will send a reminder notification to residents by automated call in advance of street sweeping. Parking restrictions must be observed so the street sweeper can adequately clean the street. Be aware parking violations will be enforced.

Police Body-Worn Cameras

The Elizabethtown Police Department has fully implemented the wearing of body-worn cameras to assist with providing an enhanced level of transparency and protection for the officers and the community. Chief Cunningham said, "I am a huge proponent of the body-worn cameras. This tool gives us the opportunity to have an objective view into what happens during an incident and to document things that are said and done on a call. The cameras also give us the ability to continue to strengthen our relationship with our community members and to continue to foster the trust that exists between us."



The body-worn cameras, as part of an overall upgrade to the mobile audio and video recording capabilities of the EPD, are not a solution all by themselves, but along with increased community engagement and proactive activity in the Borough, they will help the police continue to increase the professional service that they provide.

Payment is due on or before the following dates:

February 1st | May 1st | August 1st | November 1st

Please be aware that online banking checks can take up to a week to be processed and mailed by the issuing financial institution. Be sure to allow ample time for your payment to be received in our office by the due date to avoid a late penalty.

You may request to receive utility bills via email, have payments automatically withdrawn from a bank account, or pay online.
