# Police Department Updates



# Precription Drug Take Back Program

The Elizabethtown Police Department collects unwanted pharmaceuticals (prescription

medications) throughout the year at the police station during normal business hours, Monday-Friday,7:30am- 4:00pm. The Police Department will





medications or throwing them into the trash can have adverse effects on the environment. Aside from possibly damaging the treatment facilities, sewer treatment plants are not able



to remove all the chemicals, and therefore drugs may make it into our waterways which enter streams, rivers, wildlife and plant life.

## 2017 RECYCLING SCHEDULE

**Curbside Trash & Recycling** 

Residents may put out one 32-gallon container weighing less than 30 lbs. per week on their designated collection day, one large item that does not fit into a 32-gallon container, and commingled recycling. Cardboard is also accepted at the curb and will be picked up on your regular trash day (Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday) so long as it is flattened and easy for the loaders to handle. If flattened cardboard will not fit in your recycling container, it may be bundled and placed at the curb beside your recycling container. Shredded paper is no longer accepted as a recycling material and must be disposed of with regular trash. Also please be aware that recyclable items placed in plastic bags will not be collected.

Recycling bins are no longer available at the Borough Office, but you can stop by weekdays between 7:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. to pick up free 8" recycling symbol stickers. You can continue to use your green bin, or use any plastic container, such as a full-sized trash can with a lid.

Additional tags for trash collection beyond your one container limit may be purchased for \$2 each at the Borough Office and local stores. When using an extra container, affix the tag to the top item inside the container or to the outside of the extra bag.

#### 2017 Holiday Trash Delays

If a holiday should fall on your regular collection day (Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday), pickup will be moved to Friday of that week. Collection for the day falling on the holiday is the only day that will be affected—no other change in collection that week will occur. This year holiday trash delays will occur on the following dates:

• November 23rd (Thanksgiving) will be collected on Friday, November 24th)

#### **Yard Waste Collection**

Yard waste (soft and woody) is collected every other week on the same day as regular trash and recycling pick-up. Soft and woody yard waste can be combined and placed in a container/can of your choice. As with recycling stickers, free yard waste stickers are available at the Borough Office between 7:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Branches not placed in a can or other non-disposable container should be tied with string in bundles up to 20 inches in diameter and less than 4' in length and set at the curb. Please keep in mind that containers should weigh no more than 30 lbs. Kraft leaf bags are designated for collection of leaves only (see schedule below), not for soft or woody yard waste.

#### **Christmas Tree Collection**

Once all bags, tinsel and decorations are removed, residents may put Christmas trees at the curb at their convenience for pick up on any of the regular yard waste collection dates on their trash collection day.

Leaf Collections – {Leaves Only}

collection of placed Curbside *leaves* biodegradable Kraft leaf bags (available free to residents) occurs on the same day as regular trash collection on the following dates:

- •October 31
- •November 1, 2, 14, 15, 16, 28, 29, 30
- •December 12, 13, 14

Please note these are leaf collections days only, not yard waste collection dates. Roll the top of the Kraft bag closed, but please refrain from using tape to seal the bags.

**Kraft Leaf Bag Distribution** 

Each year the Borough purchases 46,000 biodegradable Kraft leaf bags through a joint purchasing arrangement with the Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority for approximately \$0.28 each. While supplies last, Kraft leaf bags are provided free of charge to Borough residents for leaf collections. Residents are urged to take only the number of bags they expect to need for their individual property; there is a 25-bag limit each time you pick up bags. Please do not use Kraft bags for soft and woody yard waste collections. Kraft leaf bags are available at the Scout House in Community Park on Verdant Alley on the following dates:

# MS4 Update

Lawn clippings contain phosphorus which is one of the leading causes of poor water quality in our streams and ponds. Grass clippings that end up in waterways contribute to the growth of algae and aquatic weeds. The result of pollutants can be observed as thick green residue on the surface of ponds and streams. Do not discard grass clippings in any waterway or along any stream bank. Also, do not blow or sweep grass clippings into the street because clippings will enter drains which empty directly into waterways. This small step can greatly improve water quality.



# Sidewalk Requirements

The Existing Structures & Property Maintenance Code establishes minimum standards for all structures within the Borough in order to protect the public health, safety and welfare of the general public. Sidewalks are considered public areas that must be kept in a proper state of repair, free from snow, ice, mud, overhanging trees and shrubs, and other debris. Any trees adjacent to a public sidewalk must maintain a clearance of 10 feet above the sidewalk. Please be advised, public sidewalks must be cleared within 12 hours following the cessation of any falling snow, sleet or freezing rain. #### WWTP - Inflow

What is Inflow in the sewage collection system? Inflow is water entering the sanitary sewer through illegal connections. Such as sump pumps, roof, cellar and yard drains.Inflow is a problem because this flow goes directly into the sanitary sewer and to the treatment plant. During major rain events, inflow can cause sewer lines to surcharge (flow at or above the capacity of the sewer lines) and potentiallycause backups in the collection system. Please check your downspouts and sump pump connections. Help out by removing any illegal connections from the sewage collection system. Doing this will benefit you, your neighbors and the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

# Winter Weather Advisory

The Borough's public works crews perform snow removal and de-icing operations whenever road conditions call for these services. Please remember that snow removal operations are being performed under emergency conditions. Here are a few tips that may help you avoid shoveling headaches....

- •If possible, wait to shovel the last six (6) feet of your driveway until we have completed curb to curb plowing on your street.
- If at all possible, please park all vehicles in driveways and off the street so our crews can plow back to the curb.
- Vehicles parked in any lot owned, operated or managed by the Borough, or on any Borough street for a continuous period of time greater than 72 hours is prohibited.
- •Cul-de-sacs are particularly difficult to plow. Borough crews will place the snow accumulation in the most practical area.

Above all, please be patient and allow our employees time to do their jobs when plowing streets. Safe streets are a primary concern for the Borough during the winter months. Thank you for your patience and cooperation.

# **Snow Emergency Routes**

According to Borough ordinance, after any snow emergency is declared and at any time during the continuance of the emergency, it shall be unlawful for anyone to drive a vehicle (unless it is equipped with snow tires or chains) or park a vehicle on a snow emergency route. These restrictions assist Borough crews and emergency personnel in combating the hazards of snow and ice and facilitate the movement of traffic on the snow emergency routes.

The following streets are designated as snow emergency routes in Elizabethtown Borough:

- High Street the entire length
- Market Street the entire length
- College Avenue Market Street to Spruce Street
- Spruce Street College Avenue to Willow Street
- Willow Street Spruce Street to Market Street

If a snow emergency for Elizabethtown Borough is declared, information on its implementation and duration will be announced through local media outlets, with a SWIFT911 call, and postings on the Borough's website and Facebook page.
