A Message from the Chief of Police:

When someone contacts you in any way to discuss any stimulus check that you may receive, please take a moment and always ask yourself these three questions:

- Who is this message from?
- What do they want me to do?
- What evidence supports the message?

Remember that the federal government will NEVER contact you by telephone or text message to facilitate the delivery of any assistance that you may receive, and that you will NEVER be asked to pay a processing fee or give anyone any personal information to receive this assistance.
